Subject: Conflict Minerals

Under “miscellaneous provisions” of the Dodd-Frank Act HR-4173 Section 1502 is the Conflict Minerals which requires companies to verify and disclose the source of certain materials originating in DRC countries.

The Act imposes additional reporting and due diligence requirements if the listed minerals originated in the DRC; Angola, Burundi, Congo, Rwanda, Uganda, Tanzania, Zambia, United Republic of Tanzania and the Central African Republic.

The list of minerals defined in Section 1502 as possibly financing conflict in the DRC countries are: columbite/tantalite, also known as coltan (tantalum, niobium); cassiterite (tin); wolframite (tungsten); and gold; and the derivatives of each of these minerals.

As a distributor, and not a manufacturer, Univar cannot attest to the sourcing origin of any materials used by the manufacturers in the production of the items Univar Solutions then distributes to customers. However, upon request Univar will attempt to collect Conflict Minerals statements from the suppliers of the products in question. Univar cannot guarantee that it will receive responses from the manufacturers, but will make commercially reasonable efforts to obtain a written response.
